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Introduction

The residents of the Village of Baraga are fortunate to live in a region blessed with outstanding outdoor recreation opportunities. Residents can and do participate in a variety of outdoor recreational pursuits in all seasons, including sport fishing, hunting, boating, kayaking, hiking and skiing. As a small waterfront community, the Village of Baraga has worked to improve access to the waterfront and is continuing to enhance that with lakefront land acquisition, a walking trail, shore fishing opportunities, and boating facilities, while also providing facilities for youth sports.

The Village of Baraga Community Parks and Recreation Plan describes the community, inventories existing recreation facilities, and provides a five-year action program for future recreational development. This Recreation Plan was adopted by the Village Council on February 25, 2015.

Regional Context

The Village of Baraga is located in central Baraga County, in the western Upper Peninsula of Michigan. The village's eastern boundary is formed by L'Anse Bay, part of Keweenaw Bay, Lake Superior. This striking waterfront setting is an important part of the community's identity. Views of the lake and the surrounding hills can be seen throughout the village.

The Village of Baraga was founded on a site once occupied by an Indian Community, and the Village is part of the L'Anse Indian Reservation. In the seventeenth century, the first white men came to the area as French missionaries, voyageurs and traders following the south shore of Lake Superior westward from Sault Ste. Marie. The early 1800's witnessed extensive area involvement in the fur trade. Father Frederick Baraga established a Roman Catholic Mission at Assinins in 1843. Both the Village and the County took Father Baraga's name.

The Village of Baraga was incorporated in 1891. Lumbering, fishing, mining and agriculture attracted a variety of immigrants to the area and population peaked in the early part of the century. In recent years, the economy of the area has shifted towards manufacturing, tourism, casino gaming, and government services.



The Village is situated and parallel to US Highway 41. Michigan Highway M-38 runs east-west through the Village to its junction with US Highway 41 near the waterfront.

Average snowfall in the Baraga area exceeds 200 inches annually. The coldest months are January and February, when the average temperature is 12°F. The hottest month is July, with an average temperature of 65°F. The Village's temperatures are moderated by Lake Superior, resulting in warmer winters and cooler summers. factor in the amount of precipitation the Village receives annually.

Population Characteristics

According to the US Census, the 2020 population of the Village of Baraga was 1,883 persons. Population characteristics for the Village are somewhat skewed due to the location of the Baraga Prison, which currently has about 800 inmates. Prison population data was added to the US Census in 2010 which makes analysis of population trends difficult. Gender, race, age, income, and educational characteristics may not reflect the actual Village population.

Like most Upper Peninsula communities, the Village likely lost population due to out-migration, the lack of job opportunities, an aging population, and shrinking household sizes.

Existing Land Use

The Village of Baraga contains a variety of land uses that include residential, commercial, industrial and vacant properties. Existing land use in the Village of Baraga is described as follows:

The U.S. Highway 41 corridor is characterized by a mix of older and newer commercial development, a lodging establishment, service-oriented businesses, the KBIC tribal planning office and residential land use. The Village Water Treatment Plant is located on the waterfront on US 41, as is the Baraga County Historical Museum and the village marina and park.

The US 41 corridor north of the M-38 intersection is residential land use, the post office, cemetery, Michigan DNR office, and an industrial park.


The M-38 corridor includes single family residential, multi-family residential, tribal properties, lodging, and the Ojibway Casino.

The downtown district is located along Superior Street, and parallels US 41 to the west. Some residential units are located above commercial space in downtown buildings. The downtown includes a number of vacant lots suitable for new infill construction of mixed use retail, office and residential buildings.

Industrial land uses are located primarily to the north and southeast of the residential areas of the Village. Several residential neighborhoods of varying density surround the central core of the Village.

Administrative Structure

In the Village, park and recreation facilities are managed primarily by the village manager with oversight by the council's three-member Recreation Committee, which makes recommendations on major initiatives to the full council for approval. An organization chart is shown below. The Village supports and maintains recreation facilities through annual General Fund appropriations. In 2021, the Village budgeted approximately \$95,000 for maintenance and operations of recreation facilities. Maintenance functions are carried out by Village employees.



Description of the Planning Process

The development of the Village of Baraga Community Parks and Recreation Plan involved residents, Village Council members, the Recreation Committee, a Recreation Focus Group, and the Village Manager.

Considerable input was gathered while developing a Master Plan for the Village in 2018, including a community survey and visioning exercises. To summarize, most residents suggested the Village take better advantage of its waterfront setting by acquiring available land, creating a walking trail, and developing more park facilities on Keweenaw Bay.

The Village Recreation Committee met and reviewed the Master Plan and previous Recreation Plan and concurred with the direction of previous plans and projects.

A Recreation Focus Group was also convened, which included the Village Recreation Committee, persons representing sport fishing, ORV trails, a tribal member, and Village businesses, as well as two representatives of the Michigan DNR/Baraga State Park. This group also reviewed previous recreation planning efforts and concurred with the direction of the Village.

A Recreation Plan Open House for the purpose of soliciting public involvement was held on August 16, 2021. This event was publicized by a published public notice and posting on the Village website. Eleven (11) persons attended the Open House, and had informal discussions about current and future recreation projects with the Village Staff, Recreation Committee members, and consultant. Ideas included having kite flying area in the new park, using native plants for landscaping to create a butterfly sanctuary, creating wildlife and bird viewing areas, especially for trumpeter swans, and creating a community wayfinding system to direct visitors to historical and recreation sites.

Following the preparation of a draft Recreation Plan, a notice was published in the *L'Anse Sentinel* on September 1, 2021, and started the 30-day public comment period. The notice indicated the Recreation Plan was available for viewing on the Village website and at the Village office. The same advertisement advised citizens where to obtain a copy of the draft recreation plan, as well as provide notice of the Public Hearing scheduled for October 12, 2021.

The Public Hearing was held by the Baraga Village Council on the recreation plan was held October 12, 2021, to receive any public comments or concerns on the draft plan.

Village Of Baraga Recreation Facilities

Baraga Marina and Boat Launch

The Baraga Marina has facilities for mooring approximately 28 recreational boats, and a boat launching ramp with courtesy dock. Slips are provided with water, electricity, and pump-out services. Fuel is available. The marina has a boater comfort station with ADA compliant restrooms and showers. Portions of the marina docks are not ADA compliant.



Boardwalk and Fishing Pier

Adjacent to the Village Marina is a Boardwalk and Fishing Pier providing views of the Bay and a shore fishing opportunity.



Baraga Municipal Recreation Building Complex

This facility provides indoor ice for public skating hockey on a regulation-size hockey rink. The facility also has changing rooms, concession rooms, and a Zamboni service room. The facility is ADA compliant.



Waterfront Trail

The Village has partnered with the Keweenaw Bay Indian Community (KBIC) to construct a walking and biking pathway from Sand Point north of the Village to the Baraga State Park. It is part of an overall plan to connect Sand Point to Zeba on the L'Anse side of Keweenaw Bay. Phase 1 was recently constructed by the KBIC and connects Sand Point to the Marina, and runs through the recently acquired Baraga Waterfront Park. Phase 2 is being developed by the Village and funding is in place for construction. The Village maintains the Phase 1 segment.



Baraga's Children's Park

The fenced playground and park has swings, teeter totters, slides, picnic tables, benches, swinging benches, and a rest room. ADA compliant restroom.



Baraga Waterfront Park

The six (6) acre “Jacobson Property” on the Bay was recently acquired, and the Village has been improving it with grading in anticipation of further development. The Village has applied for funding to acquire an adjacent 1.7-acre parcel. The Waterfront Trail crosses the property. The Village intends to prepare a Master Plan for the site to guide future development. Possible improvements include a pavilion, restrooms, kayak launch, permanent cornhole, pickleball, and ping pong courts, volleyball court, a horseshoe court, boardwalks, playground equipment, kite flying area, and disc golf.



Historical Society Waterfront Park

The Village owns a small parcel of land on U.S. 41 that is the site of the Baraga County Historical Society museum and a small waterfront park. The historical society wishes to make future improvements to the waterfront park including picnic tables and sitting benches, a walking path accessible to people of all abilities (Universal Accessibility), and small pedestrian bridges. Not ADA Compliant. A farmer's market is held on a weekly basis on the site.



Marilyn Ross Memorial Court

The Village DDA provided funds to construct a basketball court, including concrete surface, goals, lighting, and fencing, in honor of Marilyn Ross who served on the DDA for more than 20 years.



Regional Recreation Facilities

Baraga State Park

The Baraga State Park is located on the southern boundary of the Village. The park is a huge community asset and attracts thousands of visitors each year. The park features a short hiking trail, a playground, toilets, a horseshoe court, a sanitation station for campers, and pedestrian access to Keweenaw Bay.

Baraga State Park is part of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources (MDNR), Parks & Recreation Division (PRD) and one of 103 throughout the state. There is a strong heritage of conservation, historic preservation, education, and outdoor recreation for the public. PRD is also a member of the Michigan Recreation and Parks Association. Baraga State Park is proud to be the oldest state park in the contiguous Upper Peninsula. The park has been attracting campers and tourists since 1921. For 100 years, the park has undergone many changes while still retaining the same mission, importance and value within Baraga Township and Baraga County. The park also has significant value regionally.

Baraga State Park, set along Lake Superior's scenic Keweenaw Bay, is popular for hiking, kayaking, camping and ORV-friendly recreation. Baraga State Park is a modern

campground with 95 sites situated on 58 acres. The park includes 20-30-50 amp electrical services, full hook-up sites, pull through sites, mini-cabin and modern restroom facilities.

The park is one of just a few state parks that allow the operation of an ORV between the campground and nearby ORV trails. The park connects to Twin Lakes and Bewabic State Parks and Bond Falls Scenic Site via several motorized routes.

Baraga State Park is a very family friendly park along with a destination for residents for programs and events, working vacations and as a base camp for visiting many local and Western Upper Peninsula attractions.


Trails

Recreational trails have become an increasingly popular amenity for communities. When asked, residents frequently cite non-motorized trails as the most important recreation facility a community can offer. People today want safe trails for walking and biking in order to gain the health benefits of those activities. In addition, more people are choosing to walk or bike as a means of transportation instead of using a car.

Snowmobile and ATVs are very popular in the Baraga County area as well.

Motorized Trails

Village of Baraga Residents currently have access to recreational trails for snowmobiles and ATVs. Trails 14 and 15 provide access to a vast network of snowmobile trails in Baraga county as well as connecting north to the Keweenaw Peninsula, east to the Marquette area and south to the Iron County area.

Non-Motorized Trails

It has long been a dream of the Village of Baraga to develop a non-motorized trail along the waterfront in the Village. In recent years, the Keweenaw Bay Indian Community began the process of developing a trail that would include a segment through the Village of Baraga. The KBIC received a grant from the Michigan Economic Development Corporation to perform a feasibility study to be used for planning and design of a non-motorized pathway connecting the community of Zeba with the Sand Point Recreation Area, via the villages of L'Anse and Baraga.



Many factors were considered during this evaluation process including: stakeholder input and desires, applicable local/state/federal agency input, permitting considerations, environmental and historical impacts, scenery, soils, terrain and general constructability, construction costs, property acquisition needs, potential economic impacts, access to existing infrastructure and points of interest, and numerous other considerations.

Tourists seek access to the outdoors and the natural environment as a primary reason for visiting the area. A trail linking these areas would provide a way for tourists to enjoy their natural surroundings and provide additional incentive to remain in the L'Anse/Baraga area, further advancing the area's appeal as a "destination" for travelers.

Phase 1 of this project was constructed in 2018 and begins at Sand Point and terminates at the Village Marina. Funding for Phase 2 has been approved and the Village is awaiting approval of a final permit for a small portion of the trail. This segment will connect Baraga State Park to the Baraga Marina through the Village of Baraga. This section would be another easily constructed section features flat grades for ease of use and views of Keweenaw Bay along its 1.23-mile length and also provide trail users the opportunity to access the Village of Baraga's downtown area. The north end of the section would tie into planned future development that includes a waterfront park near the existing marina and boat launch. The trail will cross US 41 at 3rd Street.

Outdoor Recreation Sites and Facilities

Goals and Objectives

1. Expand recreational opportunities for residents and visitors in a manner that makes the Village more livable and that visitors find attractive.
2. Make the Village more livable for residents by providing more close-by recreational opportunities, especially along the Village's underutilized waterfront.
3. Promote more healthy activities for Village residents, such as more walking trails and biking paths.

Ideas and comments expressed by Village residents support the following objectives:

- Continue to develop the boardwalks and walking trail along the bay
- Acquire the additional land adjacent to the new waterfront park site, prepare a master plan for the site, and implement a variety of improvements
- Improve the trail connection between the village and the state park
- Improve the marina as funding becomes available
- Create multi-use trails for walking in summer, snowmobiling in winter

- Multi-use trails joining other communities
- Ice rink improvements
- Consider developing wildlife and bird viewing opportunities, especially trumpeter swans and other waterfowl that inhabit the Bay
- Create appropriate landscaping in the new waterfront park that features native plants for a butterfly sanctuary
- Develop a community wayfinding/kiosk system that directs visitors to natural, historical, and recreation sites, and provides information about the community





Public Comment: The subject of whether the Village of Baraga should opt in or out on a marihuana facility was discussed. A guest questioned why we are donating to Upset if we are contemplating allowing a marihuana facility to be opened in the Village of Baraga. He believed it would be bad for our youth. Another guest stated she would love to have a facility in the Village as she has to travel out of the county to get her medicine.

Motion made by A. Mayo seconded by S. Koski to hold a Special Council Meeting on October 19, 2021 at 5:45 P.M. in the Council Chambers to discuss whether the Village of Baraga should opt in or out of allowing a marihuana facility in the Village.

The Public Hearing on the Village of Baraga Recreation Plan opened at 5:57 P.M. on October 12, 2021. The recreation plan was made available to the public earlier this year for comments. Some public input was received. The new recreation plan will be beneficial in obtaining grants for the Village of Baraga. The plan will be submitted early in 2022 and will be in effect from 2022 through 2027.

The Public Hearing for the Village of Baraga Recreation Plan closed at 5:59 P.M. October 12, 2021.

Motion made by A. Cerroni seconded by A. Mayo to approve Resolution #2021-10-12-01 approving the Village of Baraga Parks and Recreation Plan.

Motion carried.

Motion made by A. Mayo seconded by S. Koski to approve Change Order #3 for the Wastewater Treatment Improvements Project and to approve Resolution #2021-10-12-02 for Payment No. 4 in the amount of \$380,288.68 to Danielson Contracting, Inc for the Village of Baraga Wastewater Systems Improvements Project.

Motion carried.

A presentation was given by Marty Dreischmeier regarding the background and accomplishments of WPPI. Brett Niemi, WPPI, discussed a rate study done on the Village's electric rates. He suggested raising the rates for small commercial businesses and residents while decreasing the rates for the large size commercial customer. He said this would reduce the risk to the Village if one of the major businesses happened to close down. B. Niemi discussed increasing the residential monthly service charge to \$10.00 and also charge more for peak distribution hours. The increase could be staggered over a few years. The council decided to look into the matter at a later date.

Michael Grentz, CPA for Anderson, Tackman & Company, PLC, discussed the recent audit of the Village of Baraga by their company. Net position of the Village as a whole increased by \$64,318 as a result of this year's operations. Net position of the governmental activities increased by \$172,744 and net position of the business-type activities decreased by \$108,426. During the year, the Village had expenses for governmental activities that were \$1,784,108 and revenues and transfers totaling \$1,956,852. The Village also had expenses for business-type activities that were \$3,395,206 and revenues and transfers totaling \$3,286,780. The General Fund is gradually increasing due to shifting allocated expenses. Local and Major Streets are still struggling with the increase in property tax exemptions and the Village won't be able to afford any road improvements for another two years or so. Mr. Grentz did suggest raising rates in the sewer fund which will be discussed at a future meeting.

The Police Report was given by I. Smith, Chief of Police. Forty-two complaints were received in the month of September. One arrest was made. Three hundred ninety property checks were completed. I. Smith, Chief of Police, and Officer M. Shalifoe were busy attending instructional training in the month of September. They attended a fall firearm qualifications training on September 21 at the Ottawa Sportsmen Club. A defensive tactic training was also held there on September 21. On September 27-29, they attended street crime training in Marquette at Northern Michigan University.

L. LeClaire, Village Manager, gave the Manager's Report. LeClaire attend the WPPI meeting in Pewaukee. The Village of Baraga received an award for 130 Years of Public Power.

L. LeClaire, Village Manager, gave the DPW Report. Lagoon work and mowing was done. A sewer line was replaced on Lyons Street. Winter sand was hauled to the shop. Vehicles are being prepared for winter.

L. LeClaire, Village Manager, had a meeting with the Fire Committee and the Township of Baraga on the need for a new fire truck. Jeff Mayo and Taylor Mayo were also there representing the Baraga Fire Department. Plans are being made to also meet with the Keweenaw Bay Indian Community on a contribution towards the truck which would roughly cost \$450,000.00.

Trick or Treat hours were set for 4:00 P.M. to 7:00 P.M. on October 31, 2021.

C. Swartz, Keweenaw Bay Indian Community, was present to discuss the proposed second phase of the walking trail. He discussed the fast traffic in the crossing area. MDOT has been approached by the Village of Baraga and the Keweenaw Bay Indian Community several times to lower the speed limit to 45 miles per hour, but has continued to refuse citing there has not been enough accidents to warrant it. C. Swartz said the KBIC council could not approve the proposed walking trail due to safety hazards. W. Dompier explained that a crosswalk with lights would be put up along with signage. He also stated that over a million dollars in grants would be lost if they did not get approval for the crosswalk from the KBIC council by October 15, 2021. S. Koski stated the trail actually will make the walk to the Baraga State Park safer than walking along the side of the road and the it is an excellent opportunity that shouldn't be passed up. C. Swartz said due to a funeral in the tribal community he would not be able to have another council meeting by that date. However, he would try to discuss the matter individually with each council member before October 15.

Motion made by A. Cerroni seconded by A. Mayo to pay the bills when the monies become available.
